

All Saints Day ..... November 1, 2020

All Saints' Day is a time each year when loved ones must say goodbye to those who have died in the faith. 1 John comforts those who mourn with the promise that death is not the end for those who are the children of God. While they are in the world, they see the effects of death and decay, but John reminds us that this will not be their end.

There is a Cry Room available for use during our worship service. It is located just outside the sanctuary. Children Leaving the Sanctuary: This is a matter of caring concern for your child, or the young child that you are responsible for, age 13 or younger. The Board of Lay Ministry asks that if your child needs to leave the sanctuary during the worship service, you as a parent or responsible adult will need to escort them to and from the sanctuary. Thank you *The Lord's Supper* is a very special privilege God gives to His people. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder.
