
Traditionally, Advent is a period of prayer, penance and preparation to celebrate Christ's first coming. The Third Sunday in Advent is commonly referred to as "Rejoice Sunday", a reference to the Epistle (1 Thess. 5:16-24: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing") and the Old Testament Reading (Is. 61:1-4, 8-11: "I will greatly rejoice in the Lord; my soul shall exult in my God, for He has clothed me with the garments of salvation").

There is a Cry Room available for use during our worship service. It is located just outside the sanctuary. Children Leaving the Sanctuary: This is a matter of caring concern for your child, or the young child that you are responsible for, age 13 or younger. The Board of Lay Ministry asks that if your child needs to leave the sanctuary during the worship service, you as a parent or responsible adult will need to escort them to and from the sanctuary. Thank you **The Lord's Supper** is a very special privilege God gives to His people. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder.


1 Thessalonians 5:16–24




Nicene Creed
