First Peter (in general) and our text (in particular) speak to our baptismal identity as "newborn infants" (2:2). After addressing his hearers as "elect exiles" (1:1), Peter opens with a high doxology: "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to His great mercy, He has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1:3). He further acknowledges that "now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials" (1:6). These twin conditions of God's people, negative and positive, will run throughout our text. Over against the world, they are exiled and rejected, but in God's eyes, they are elect in Christ and precious.

<u>The Lord's Supper</u> is a very special privilege God gives to His people. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.


