Reformation Day reminds us of the central article of the faith: the work of Christ alone appeases God's wrath and redeems the sinner's debt, here and eternally. To this truth, brought to light anew by the Wittenberg Reformation, Luther was called to testify before the emperor—and we teach it to each new generation. What a blessing to have our Youth participate in the service this morning! Thank God for His Word!

The Lord's Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

The Five Solas are foundational principles that came out of the Reformation : **Sola Scriptura** ("Scripture alone"): The Bible alone is our highest authority (*1 Timothy 3: 14-17*). **Sola Fide** ("faith alone"): We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ (*Romans 3:21-28*). **Sola Gratia** ("grace alone"): We are saved by the grace of God alone (*Eph 2:4-9*). **Solus Christus** ("Christ alone"): Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior, and King (*John 14:1-7*). **Soli Deo Gloria**: ("to the glory of God alone") The purpose of creation, salvation and everything is that God may be all in all (<u>*1 Peter 4:7-13*</u>).


