From the Board of Evangelism Mission Committee:

Haiti Update from the Mission Committee

We wanted to share the latest news from Mission Haiti. Haiti is going through much gang activity and violence at this time so the news from Sue was indeed a blessing. Please continue to keep those who are working to spread the gospel and the people of Haiti in your prayers.

Good news!!!

The schools in Jeremie, Haiti are open. Most schools in Port au Prince are not open due to the

civil unrest and gang activity. But our schools in the rural areas of the Jeremie District are open and ready for some new instruction.

Pastor Jymitry Dorce a young Pastor that has been appointed by the Pastors from the Haitian LCMS Seminary will be traveling to each of our seven sponsored schools in Jeremie. He will be putting together a program for the teachers to learn more about the Lutheran Faith and how to instruct the children in Lutheran History and basic Christian principals. Although there has been some instruction in our schools for the past several years on this matter, this will be a structured plan for each school to follow and Pastor Dorce will make quarterly visits to make sure it is being taught properly and updated as needed.

Mission Haiti recently bought Pastor Dorce a motorcycle for this purpose. In the past we did not have anyone qualified to make regular visits to the schools because of the distance between them and the rough mountain terrain. I have been in touch with Pastor Dorce and he is very excited to be involved with our schools and will be sending me his plan and repots quarterly.

Though we are still not able to travel to Haiti at this time we look forward to this coming school year and ask you please to help sponsor one of our 49 Lutheran School Teachers. We are still paying them only \$50 a month and this is barely enough to put food on their tables for a week or two because of the rising cost but they appreciate anything we can do to help and have never asked for more. As you can see we are desperately asking for your help. We have 7 schools and 7 teachers in each school. This cost us \$2,450.00 a month to keep the schools open. If a Bible Class or a group of families would sponsor one teacher for a year it would cost them only \$600. Please consider helping us to keep the schools open for another year.

Pieces will be available towards the end of November or early December. Look for more info in the November bulletins. Thank you for the support you have given to God's children in Haiti.

Becoming a Choice (voucher) school has helped with tuition for many of our families. We also offer additional scholarships through the LSGO (Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization), a Church Partnership Scholarship for active membership in a student's home church, and a School Partnership Scholarship for those who volunteer within the school and

PTL; as well as using the Tuition Assistance Fund as needed. Some of our families are able to receive full scholarship awards, making a Christian school education affordable.

Since we still use the LSGO to help cover remaining tuition costs for eligible families, we need to maintain funds in the SGO. **Please continue to give, and remember you will receive a tax credit and deduction for your donations!** You can find several (easy) ways to donate at www.lutheranSGO.org/Donate. Donations can be given through a check, IRA, stocks, Donor Advised Funds, PayPal, credit card, and **NOW electronic giving!** <u>Benefits to you are a 50%</u> state tax credit for your donation and eligibility for a tax deduction. These scholarships make a big difference for our families. If you desire to mail a check to the LSGO, pamphlets with mailing information are available in the tract rack. (Checks need to be written to the Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization.)

We also continue to take donations to St. Paul's tuition assistance fund. Checks for tuition assistance can be made out to the church.

UPDATE ON REVITALIZATION PROGRAM

Since the Revitalization Program was started, there has been quite a bit of activity involving the various boards, directors of boards and school staff. Some of these activities are as follows>

* Completion of "Connect to Disciple" workshop by day and preschool school staff, directors of all church boards, Pastor Wonnacott and church and school secretaries. The focus on the

workshop was recognizing opportunities in our church, school and communities to create disciples...the mission every Christian has been given by Christ.

* Completion of "Shepherding the Strays" workshop by board of Lay Ministry and Pastor Wonnacott. The focus of this workshop was how to work with church members who have decreased their involvement in attending worship services, Bible studies and church activities in order to assist them in the spiritual walk with Christ.

* Establishment of revised and Vision and Mission statements for St Paul's church and school. These statements are as follows:

VISION

From Strategic Planning Session 9/25/23:

"A Christian family of believers, led by the Holy Spirit, going out into the Bremen community and surrounding areas to make disciples of St. Paul's members and the unchurched."

MISSION

From Strategic Planning Session 9/25/23:

"Through God's saving grace St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church and School will equip its families to develop and grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ so that they may share his good news of salvation."

* Establishment of Strategic Plan goals that will be completed by the boards of the congregation. These goals and which board is assigned for completion are as follows:

4. Develop a plan for providing a personal financial literacy class/program to St. Paul's, Bremen and the surrounding communities by March 1, 2024.

* assigned to Stewardship Board

5. Make contact and receive responses from all inactive church members by June 1, 2024 and based on responses, update church membership list by October 1, 2024.

* assigned to Board of Lay Ministry

6. Identify talents and abilities of congregation members to match needs of all church boards by March 31, 2024.

* assigned to Stewardship Board; input required from all boards to Stewardship Board that list the needs of each board. These lists to be provided to Stewardship by November 20, 2023.

"Judgment, Please!"

Isaiah 51:5 - My righteousness draws near, My salvation has gone out, and My arms will judge the peoples; the coastlands hope for Me, and for My arm they wait.

What do you think of when you think of God's judgment? If you are like most Christians, judgment is a frightening concept. We think of ourselves as defendants in a criminal case, and God as the prosecutor, witness, and judge, all rolled into one.

That scares us. We are deeply aware of our sins. Just like King David prayed in Psalm 143:2, we pray, "Enter not into judgment with Your servant, for no one living is righteous before You." We know very well as it says in Psalm 130:3 -- "If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, O Lord, who could stand?" Certainly, not us!

But that's not what Isaiah is getting at in this verse. He's drawing the picture of a civil case: a case where *we* are the plaintiffs, and *we* are suing for justice against those who have hurt us!

In Isaiah's day, justice was even harder to come by than it is today. If the plaintiffs were poor, or socially unimportant, or didn't have money to offer a bribe -- why, then, their case might never even be heard, let alone settled. The judge would simply refuse them a court hearing. That meant people like the poor widow in Jesus' parable in Luke 18 could go for years with an absolutely airtight case against an evil landlord or an oppressive neighbor, and still never get help, let alone justice. Small wonder she was begging for judgment!

We are actually in this same case, too, every day. We may be fortunate enough to live in a place where access to the courts is available, and even the poor get their cases heard. But what about the huge amount of evil in this world that cannot be set right by winning a lawsuit? What about cancer and heart disease, poverty and hunger, child and elder abuse, unfair laws and violence in the streets? Those most definitely are the work of the devil, and also the result of society-wide problems we've never been able to manage. How can we get justice for those? Who will put a stop to them?

Only God can do that, which is why He speaks through the prophet Isaiah: "The coastlands hope for Me, and for My arm they wait." Judgment is coming for all of us who have suffered far too long under the power of evil. Only wait a little longer, and Christ will return; He will judge the nations. His salvation has already gone out; He has already died and risen for us and washed us from our sins. Now we are His people, and we can *look forward* to judgment, not with fear, but with rejoicing. God will put right everything in the universe that has gone so badly wrong. And on that day, it will be true what was written in Revelation 21:4. "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."

Christ in the hearts of Liberian children

Joe Boway founded the Liberian Children's Ministry in 2004. This ministry is now supporting 6,000 students in 15 Lutheran schools in Liberia, Africa. Over 75% of the new students are from a non-church background. To help the children learn about Jesus and the Christian faith, Joe's goal in 2023 is to collect used and new Small Catechisms to send to Liberia for each student to read in English.

Your congregation and/or school or Sunday school could adopt collecting Luther's catechisms as a mission project. They can be used or new in any edition as long as it is in English. A short history: the Plymouth Pilgrims are generally credited with the "first Thanksgiving" in 1621, upon the occasion of their first harvest. After 1630, the New England colonies held an annual observance. George Washington, designated Thursday, November 26, 1789, as a day of thanksgiving for the Constitution's ratification. In 1795, he declared another for 'general benefits.' James Madison, in 1815, asked for a day of thanks for peace (end of War of 1812). Abraham Lincoln set the precedent of *presidential proclamation* in 1863, and designated the fourth Thursday of November. Succeeding

presidents followed his practice of proclaiming a special day of thanks, but usually picked the last Thursday of the month. In 1939, the head of a major department store convinced FDR that a longer Christmas shopping season would help the economy; so his proclamation set the fourth Thursday instead of the last for Thanksgiving. The fourth Thursday became fixed as the *official* National Day of Thanksgiving in 1941, by Congressional resolution. For Christian churches in America, this day is observed by nearly all confessions as an *additional, special* occasion to thank our Triune God for creating and preserving us; giving us all that we need to sustain both body and soul. As preparation for worship, consider reading the <u>Meaning of the First Article, Luther's Small</u> Catechism. The color for this day is *white*, for this is a festival to God the Father.

Praise to God, immortal praise, for the love that crowns our days; Bounteous source of every joy, let Thy praise our tongues employ. All to Thee, our God, we owe, Source whence all our blessings flow.

All the plenty summer pours; Autumn's rich, o'er-flowing stores; Flocks that whiten all the plain; Yellow sheaves of ripened grain --Lord, for these our souls shall raise Grateful vows and solemn praise.

Sunday, November 26, is the last worship service of St. Paul's 177th Church Year (the 1st was Advent 1846, when we were a mere 6-7 weeks old!).

The designation for this last Sunday of the Church Year depends on which hymnal or lectionary (weekly listing of all readings), being used by a congregation. It may be called: Christ the King Sunday, The Sunday of the Fulfillment, or The Last Sunday of the End Times, *in* the Season of Weeks after Pentecost, *in* the Time of the Church. The color depends on what the pastor has determined as the focus of his message. *Green* for the Sunday of the Fulfillment, with the focus on Christ's completed work of redemption for our salvation; or *White* for Christ the King or End times, with the focus on Christ's glorious return and reign as King of kings, and our final consummation into His kingdom. *eay*
