In Matthew 19:14 Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven." We welcome children and all the joy and little chatter that comes with them. If for any reason you want to take your little one out, there is a Nursery (Cry Room) available for use during our worship service. It is located just outside the sanctuary.

Rejoice! There are 2 Hebrew words to describe joy (simchah) and rejoice (samach). These appear nearly 250 times in the Old Testament. In Greek it is chara and chairo which are used over 125 times in the New Testament. They don't just mean happy, but can be used to express many things like joyfulness, mirth, pleasure, delight, rejoicing, and gladness. Sometimes exceedingly so! These words express joy in our hearts, in songs and music, worship, praise, and thanksgiving – in **all** things. As we enter a new year look for the many ways in which we can rejoice. Our God is a God of exceeding joy! **Rejoice in Him!**

Rejoice in the Lord always. Again, I will say rejoice!




And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the


