The 4th Sunday After Epiphany...... January 28, 2024

Epiphany 4 continues the Epiphany theme of the Light shining on all the world. The *Gospel* for the day (Mk 1:14–20) relates the call of more disciples who would, after Pentecost, evangelize the world, though at the cost of their own lives. As Jesus calls these disciples from boats on the sea to become fishers of men, Jonah failed to escape his call to preach in Nineveh by fleeing on a boat to Tarshish. He could not escape from the Lord's call and was given a second chance to become a "fisher of men" even in Nineveh.

We welcome everyone to the Lord's House today.

<u>The Lord's Supper</u> is a very special privilege God gives to His people. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

Nunc Dimittis: Latin for "now [let Your servant] depart". A departing song in worship that also anticipates a return to the House of the Lord. *Benediction:* A blessing from the Lord, spoken by the pastor at the end of the service.
