### UPDATE ON REVITALIZATION PROGRAM

Since the Revitalization Program was started, there has been quite a bit of activity involving the various boards, directors of boards and school staff. Some of these activities are as follows>

\* Completion of "Connect to Disciple" workshop by day and preschool school staff, directors of all church boards, Pastor Wonnacott and church and school secretaries. The focus on the workshop was recognizing opportunities in our church, school and communities to create disciples...the mission every Christian has been given by Christ.

\* Completion of "Shepherding the Strays" workshop by board of Lay Ministry and Pastor Wonnacott. The focus of this workshop was how to work with church members who have decreased their involvement in attending worship services, Bible studies and church activities in order to assist them in the spiritual walk with Christ.

\* Establishment of revised and Vision and Mission statements for St Paul's church and school. These statements are as follows:

#### VISION

From Strategic Planning Session 9/25/23:

"A Christian family of believers, led by the Holy Spirit, going out into the Bremen community and surrounding areas to make disciples of St. Paul's members and the unchurched."

#### MISSION

From Strategic Planning Session 9/25/23:

"Through God's saving grace St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church and School will equip its families to develop and grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ so that they may share his good news of salvation." \* Establishment of Strategic Plan goals that will be completed by the boards of the congregation. 5. Make contact and receive responses from all inactive church members by June 1, 2024 and based on responses, update church membership list by October 1, 2024.

\* assigned to Board of Lay Ministry

6. Identify talents and abilities of congregation members to match needs of all church boards by March 31, 2024.

\* assigned to Stewardship Board; input required from all boards to Stewardship Board that list the needs of each board. These lists to be provided to Stewardship by November 20, 2023.

Prior to this being placed on an agenda for a future voters meeting, an Adult Bible study "Roles of Men and Women in the Church" will be provided beginning March 3rd during Bible Class each Sunday at 8:30 AM in the Bethany room of the Fellowship Hall. This Bible study will look at how this topic has been discussed in Synodical Conventions and what the Bible scriptures tell us. It is hoped that this Bible study will enable everyone to place their personal desires aside and be prayerfully led by the Holy Spirit in understanding God's plan provided for us as explained in the Holy Bible.

#### "Invisible"

On a Sabbath Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues, and a woman was there who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years. She was bent over and could not straighten up at all. When Jesus saw her, He called her forward and said to her, "Woman, you are set free from your infirmity." Luke 13:10-12

My first volunteer job in rural Mississippi was as janitor at the small Christian school where my husband taught. I was sure this humble position would teach me true servanthood.

When I visited the school, the teachers always said "hello" and shared stories about the kids. But when I showed up to clean, no one acknowledged me. With a mop in my hand and a scarf on my head, I became invisible. My invisibility opened my eyes to people in my own neighborhood who were "invisible": A child who wandered the streets without supervision, a man who lived in a shack, an elderly woman with bad feet.

Jesus saw the bent woman, someone who was invisible to many around her. When He healed her, none of the church leaders rejoiced. Instead, they criticized Him for healing on the Sabbath. Jesus sees us all, daughters and sons of Abraham, with an eye especially on the poor, the crippled, the imprisoned. His eye sees me, no matter how invisible I am to those around me. Through His redeeming love, I see the invisible people in my neighborhood.

Prayer: Keep my eyes ever on You, LORD, for only You can release my feet from the snare. Amen.

Response: Pray that God will help open your eyes and heart to someone invisible.

On the Church Year Calendar, Easter is seven weeks long, and its season concludes with The Feast of the Holy Spirit, Pentecost.

Christmas to Pentecost is called the Festival Half Year; because during this portion of the calendar all the major festivals of the church which focus on Christ's work of redemption and salvation - or on specific events of His earthly life - are observed:

**Christmastide**: Nativity: Jesus' Incarnation, birth; **Name Day** / **Circumcision**: Jesus, as announced by Gabriel to Mary, and repeated to Joseph} / keeping of the Law of Circumcision 8 days after birth; **Epiphany Day** & season: manifestation to the Gentiles in the visit of the wise men; **Baptism of Our Lord**: God the Father proclaims Jesus as His Son; Jesus places Himself under the law so that His atonement will be sufficient for all people **Presentation of Our Lord**: keeping of the Law of the purification for Mary; witness of Simeon and Anna of Jesus as the promised Messiah; **Transfiguration of Our Lord**:

Jesus manifests His glory as God's Son; LENTENTIDE: Ash Wednesday: time of sorrow over sin and repentance, both individually and corporately, begins, as we walk to Calvary with our Lord; Palm Sunday / Sunday of the Passion: entry into Jerusalem / beginning of Holy Week, where we observe Jesus' Passion – His suffering and death, especially the crucifixion; Maundy Thursday: historical institution of Christ's gift of the Lord's Supper; with the communion of all saints, we are strengthened in our faith, receive the forgiveness of sins, as we proclaim His death till He comes. Good Friday: anniversary of Jesus' death on the cross; we witness our Lord's suffering and yet, we can rejoice that in Him the price of our sins are fully paid. It is finished! Eastertide: Resurrection Sunday (Easter): seal of our salvation, promise of our bodily resurrection; Ascension of Our Lord: Jesus return to heaven; His eternal reign as King and Lord of all; promise of His return to take all believers to heaven; **Pentecost**: the gift of the power of the Holy Spirit to the church to fulfill the Great Commission; serve our Lord and neighbor till He comes. The last three listed are considered the three most significant observances of the church year; and all occur within Eastertide's fifty-day season. With each annual cycle of festivals, every believer has the opportunity to 'walk with Jesus' as He walked among us during His life on earth. This was the motivation for forming a calendar of 'anniversary day' observances during the 4th century when most of the calendar took shape. Since AD 600, this Festival Half Cycle has remained essentially unchanged.

The Lord's death and resurrection is at the heart of Christian faith and worship. The days are prefaced as 'feasts' from the pattern God set down to the children of Israel: "*These are the feasts of the Lord, holy convocations which you shall proclaim at their appointed times.*" Leviticus 23:4 In the celebration of these days, we display to the world the truth of our God and Savior through Jesus' atoning sacrifice, love for all people, and the sure and certain hope that we hold for our own resurrection and eternal life. We are invited by Jesus Himself to "feed" our worship life and faith through God's Word, the Holy Spirit, and in His gift of the Sacrament; all the while remembering and praising Him as God and Lord; proclaiming to all His great works on our behalf; and rejoicing in His unending love as He renews and strengthens our life and faith in Jesus Christ.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you..." I Peter 1:3,4
