The traditional *Hymn of the Day*, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," proclaims Jesus Christ as the victor over Satan, the old evil foe. We welcome all to God's house today!

The Lord's Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

OUR OFFERINGS TO THE LORD FROM HIS BLESSINGS TO US. Offerings remind us of the blessings God has given us and are an opportunity to thank Him for what He has done in our lives. Please place your offerings in our Offering Box located in front of the water fountains in the narthex of the church.

In Matthew 19:14 Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and <u>do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven."</u> We welcome children and all the joy and little chatter that comes with them. If for any reason you want to take your little one out, there is a Nursery (Cry Room) available for use, located just outside the sanctuary.

Jesus came to the Jordan River to be baptized. Why would Jesus, who had no sin, want - much less need - to be baptized? But Jesus said that He and John needed to "fulfill all righteousness" (Matt. 3:15). In His baptism, Jesus aligned Himself with His sinful people (Is. 53:12; John 1:29). As He came up out of the water, the Holy Spirit came down in the form of a dove and the Father's voice from heaven declared, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matt. 3:16–17). Jesus' baptism marked the beginning of His public ministry. As John did before Him, Jesus also proclaimed, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel" (Mark 1:15). With Jesus' ministry, the restored reign of God had arrived.
