The 5th Sunday in LentMarch 17th, 2024

The Propers for the Fifth Sunday in Lent take us to the heart of our Lord's saving work on behalf of the whole world. In the *Old Testament Reading*, the prophet Jeremiah succinctly lays out the Lord's promise of a new covenant. From this new covenant flows a gracious promise: "For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more" (Jer 31:34). This amazing forgiveness is only made possible through the sacrificial service and reverent obedience of Jesus, our great High Priest. The Lord's promise to "remember their sin no more" is surely one of the sweetest, most comforting promises in all of Scripture.

Let us worship the Lord together!

The Lord's Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

OUR OFFERINGS TO THE LORD FROM HIS BLESSINGS TO US. Offerings remind us of the blessings God has given us and are an opportunity to thank Him for what He has done in our lives. Please place your offerings in our Offering Box located in the narthex of the church.

In Matthew 19:14 Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven." We welcome children and all the joy and little chatter that comes with them. If for any reason you want to take your little one out, there is a Nursery (Cry Room) available for use, located just outside the sanctuary.

As our resurrected Lord, Jesus is our High Priest. And why did He do all this? For one reason – you. What He cared about more than anything is what He loved more than anything – you. It was for you that Jesus the High Priest gave His life on the altar of the cross. He gave His body and spilled His blood not for His sins, but for yours. And now you can turn to Him no matter what is going on in your life. He knows exactly what you're going through. He knows your hurts and your fears and He lifts them up to His Father. Your prayers are heard, never doubt that, your sins are forgiven, never doubt that, He is your rescuer, never doubt that. For the High Priest, the Perfect High Priest is your High Priest.

But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."
