

Mark began his Gospel by introducing Jesus as the Son of God (1:1). Yet (apart from the devils!), Mark had only a Roman centurion, a Gentile, not the authorities of Israel, confess Jesus as such. At the foot of the cross of Jesus, this Gentile confessed: "Truly this man was the Son of God!" And this he said after our Lord had drawn His last breath and hung dead on the cross (15:39). Mark's Christology rejects the normal or popular notion by which human beings usually portray God: as powerful, almighty, but a distant figure. As Luther reminds us, the more human Jesus is, the more God He is. Jesus saved us not with His almighty power but with His humility and weakness on the cross.

The Lord's Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.




2 Corinthians 8:1-9, 13-15

¹We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, ²for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. ³For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own free will, ⁴begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints— ⁵and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us. ⁶Accordingly, we urged Titus that as he had started, so he should complete among you this act of grace. ⁷But as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in our love for you—see that you excel in this act of grace also.

¹³I do not mean that others should be eased and you burdened, but that as a matter of fairness ¹⁴your abundance at the present time should supply their need, so that their abundance may supply your need, that there may be fairness. ¹⁵As it is written, "Whoever gathered much had nothing left over, and whoever gathered little had no lack."

The Holy Gospel Lesson

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the fifth chapter.



²¹When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered about Him, and He was beside the sea. ²²Then came one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name, and seeing Him, he fell at His feet ²³and implored Him earnestly, saying, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay Your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live." ²⁴And He went with him.

And a great crowd followed Him and thronged about Him. ²⁵And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, ²⁶ and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. ²⁷She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind Him in the crowd and touched His garment. ²⁸For she said, "If I touch even His aarments, I will be made well." ²⁹And immediately the flow of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. ³⁰And Jesus, perceiving in Himself that power had gone out from Him, immediately turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched My garments?" 31And His disciples said to Him, "You see the crowd pressing around You, and yet You say, 'Who touched Me?"" ³²And He looked around to see who had done it. ³³But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before Him and told Him the whole truth. 34And He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

³⁵While He was still speaking, there came from the ruler's house some who said, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?" ³⁶But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." ³⁷And He allowed no one to follow Him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. ³⁸They came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and Jesus saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. ³⁹And when He had entered, He said to them, "Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping." ⁴⁰And they laughed at Him. But He put them all outside and took the child's father and mother and those who were with Him and went in where the child

was. ⁴¹Taking her by the hand He said to her, "Talitha cumi," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." ⁴²And immediately the girl got up and began walking (for she was twelve years of age), and they were immediately overcome with amazement. ⁴³And He strictly charged them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

From the Church Office: I would like to get a new directory printed the first of July. A copy of the most updated version I have is on the table in the Narthex. Please look it over and make corrections as needed. Thank you for helping me with this.

Haiti Update: we have received word that violence is still very bad in Port au Prince but has not reached the more rural areas vet. Sadly, the gangs in Port au Prince keep much of the food and aid coming into the country from reaching these rural areas. MISSION HAITI, Trinity HOPE (a mission dedicated to feeding the Haitian children) and those living in Haiti like Pastor Dorce, who visits our schools and instructs our teachers and Lophane our Field Director continue to serve the people of Haiti by bringing the Gospel to our schools and food to the students. So far, we have been able to get food to 6 of the 7 schools in the Jeremie District so those children receive one meal a day while at school. Please continue to lift up the people of Haiti in your prayers and if you are able and feel moved to give, please mark your envelope "Mission Haiti". 100% of donated money goes towards keeping the Lutheran Schools open. A check for \$450 from St. Paul's was sent to Mission Haiti on Wednesday. Both of the paintings "sold" in the Mite Auction at the LWML Convention last weekend, \$91.00 was raised for mites from these two paintings. In total the auction brought in \$4,489.00 for mites to be used for various missions.
