The Lord blessed our week of VBS! Jesus gives us joy by giving us so much, even His life, which is a big reason to Celebrate. There were 54 kids who attended at least one day with an average daily attendance of 47. The breakdown of church affiliation was 21 St. Paul's, 4 from other Lutheran churches, 18 from other community churches(majority are or have been students at our preschool/day school, and 11 children did not list a church on their registration form.

It was such a blessing to have a total of 38 church members, 22 adults and 16 youth, who volunteered for Vacation Bible School! The Bible Stories focused on the reasons we should celebrate our Savior. The children learned that Jesus came for them through the lesson of the Wise men who traveled to worship Jesus. They learned about the healing power of Jesus when Jesus healed the man lowered through the roof by his friends. They heard how Jesus cares for us as he fed the five thousand. Most importantly, they heard how Jesus died and rose again so he could save all believers. Then through the lesson of Jesus talking with followers on the Road to Emmaus, they learned how Jesus' love truly fills us with joy! The

Bible lesson was acted out each day by leaders and the children. The children also learned a daily Bible verse, participated in science demonstrations, and made a craft to reinforce the day's lesson. They had fun with games/playtime and enjoyed delicious cookies made by Kevin Furman.

A big thank you to all who attended the LWML work night to help prepare crafts. There has been \$270 and items collected for Phil's Friends from members and during VBS. Vacation Bible School was a wonderful opportunity to come together to help the children of our congregation and community grow in their faith while having a great time!

THE APOSTLES CREED {Latin credo = I believe}. • Hippolytus, a bishop of Rome, wrote an account of an early 3rd century baptism: "When a person being baptized goes down into the water, he who baptizes him, putting his hand on him, shall say: 'Do you believe in God the Father Almighty?' And the person being baptized shall say: I believe.' Then holding his hand on his head, he shall baptize him once. And then he shall say: 'Do you believe in Christ Jesus, the Son of God, who was born by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and was crucified under Pontius Pilate, and was dead and buried, and rose again the third day, alive from the dead, and ascended into heaven, and sat at the right hand of the Father, and will come to judge the living and the dead?' And when he says: 'I believe,' he is baptized again. And again he shall say: 'Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, in the holy church, and the resurrection of the body?' The person being baptized shall say: 'I believe,' and then he is baptized the third time." • If this sounds familiar, it is. With only a few changes, we hear one of the

universal statements of Christian belief: <u>The Apostles' Creed</u>, which is still at the heart of the baptism liturgy. • FYI: Bishop Hippolytus (170-236) died a martyr, worked and starved to death in the mines of Sardinia, a fate suffered by many church leaders under the persecution of Decius. • The *apostolic age* is the time in which the apostles lived and preached the gospel after Jesus' Ascension; St. John is believed to be the last of The Twelve to die, of natural causes, c. 100 AD. Though named for them, it is *not written* by any of the apostles; but is a summary of their teaching which the Church acknowledged from earliest times, late 1st, early 2nd century, as a 'Rule of Faith.' • The oldest confession of faith of the church, a letter of St. Ambrose, 390 AD, first used this title; written texts appeared soon after 400 AD. The current wording is c. 750 AD. •

The question is: Where in Scripture do we find The Apostles Creed?

I believe in God the Father Almighty "When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, 'I am Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless." Genesis 17:1 "And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am." Exodus 3:14 • I AM in Hebrew, Yahweh; almost always translated LORD (the self-existent One). The word for *God* is the plural of the word for false, man-made gods when used with the article, THE, as in "THE God of Abraham....", signifying the one Supreme God: He is Three-In-One. † *Creator of heaven and earth* "For thus says the LORD, Who created the heavens, Who is God, Who formed the earth and made it, Who has established it, Who did not create it in vain, Who formed it to be inhabited: 'I am the LORD, and there is no other.'" Isaiah 45:18 "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness.." Genesis 1:26a "Have we not all one Father? Has not one God created us?" Malachi 2:10 • Though all Three Persons of the Trinity were active at Creation, the work is in general ascribed to the Father. † *And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord* "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." John 3:16 "... the Gospel of God which He promised through His prophets in the Holy Scriptures, concerning His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord..." Romans 1:1b-3a † Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit "...behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit.'" Matthew 1:20 † **Born of the Virgin Mary** "Then Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I do not know a man?" Luke 1:34 "So all this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying: 'Behold, the

virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel,' which is translated, 'God with us.'" Matthew 1:21-22 † **Suffered under Pontius Pilate** "... Pilate took Jesus and scourged Him. ... soldiers twisted a crown of thorns and put it on His head." "... he delivered Him to them to be crucified." John 19:1-2a, 16a † Was crucified, died, and was **buried** "... when they had come to the place called Calvary, there they crucified Him." John 19:30 "He said, 'It is finished!' And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit," Luke 23:33a "... they took the body of Jesus, and bound it in strips of linen with the spices, as the custom of the Jews is to bury. Now in the place where He was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. So there they laid Jesus." John 40-42a † **He descended into hell** "Now this, 'He ascended' - what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things." Ephesians 4:9-10 "... being put to death in the flesh but made alive by the Spirit, by whom also He went and preached to the spirits in prison, who formerly were disobedient, when once the Divine longsuffering waited in the days of Noah...." I Peter 3:18b-19 • The word prison: means fasten, a hold, cage. Since these are those who died in the Great Flood, it symbolizes hell, where the disobedient face judgment. Word *preached*: to herald (like a public crier) especially divine truth (Gospel). Thus, Jesus proclaimed His victory over sin and death to those in hell. † *And the third day He rose again from the dead* "And He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things...and be killed, and after three days rise again." Mark 8:31a,c "He is not here; for He is risen, as He said." Matthew 28:6a † **He ascended into heaven** "...while they watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight...they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up..." Acts 1:9b-10 † And sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty "...through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, angels and authorities and powers having been made subject to Him." I Peter 3:21c-22 † From thence, He will come to judge the living and the dead "I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ, who will judge the living and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom: Preach the word!" II Timothy 4:1,2a † *And I believe in the Holy Spirit* "And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever - the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you." John 14:16,17 "... Ananias, why has Satan filled your

heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and keep back part of the price of the land for yourself? ... You have not lied to men but to God." Acts 5:3,4d † **The holy Christian Church** "... that He might sanctify her and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish." Ephesians 5:26-27 "... we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." Hebrews 10:10 • Holy: sanctified (set apart to God, made holy); unspotted, blameless. Only through faith in Christ, by His righteousness, does His Church meet these requirements. *Church*: all true believers in Jesus {Christian}, wherever they are found. † **The communion of the saints** "God is greatly to be feared in the assembly of saints, And to be held in reverence by all those around Him." Psalm 89:7 "For God is not the author of confusion but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints." I Corinthians 14:33 "...giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light." Colossians 1:12 • Saint: one sanctified; morally blameless. *Communion*: partnership, literally participation. Includes living believers and those who died in Christ. This is a work of God in us! † *The forgiveness of* **sins** "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace." Ephesians 1:7 † *The resurrection of the body* "And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, Some to everlasting life, Some to shame and everlasting contempt." Daniel 12:2 "and the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised..." Matthew 27:52 "For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first." I Thessalonians 4:16 † *And the life everlasting* "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me has everlasting life." John 6:47 • The Apostles' Creed is of the Spirit-inspired Scriptures! This is most certainly true!
