The hymn "Es ist genug" expresses the same feelings Elijah cries out in our text, even using the same words of his lament, "It is enough" (1 Ki 19:4). Ironically, our hymn "I Am Content!" by which we know the tune from this sad hymn is a song of victorious Easter confidence. Thus, the tune forms a bridge from the words of despair, "I've had enough," to the words of victory, "I am content."

May we be content in Jesus!

#### The Lord's Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

#### OUR OFFERINGS TO THE LORD FROM HIS BLESSINGS TO US.

Offerings remind us of the blessings God has given us and are an opportunity to thank Him for what He has done in our lives. Please place your offerings in our Offering Box located in the narthex of the church.

In Matthew 19:14 Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven." #### **Worship Guide**

Lutherans like to say that in worship God serves us, not because we're so good but because what God gives is for our good. So we call worship the Divine Service, where God serves us His gifts of Word and Sacrament to enlighten our hearts and forgive. The hopeful response is our thanksgiving and praise. The order of worship is called liturgy, it dates back to the Old Testament. Jesus Christ fulfilled and even established new promises for us that to this day our worship intentionally highlights in great repetition. For more information look up the Bible references.

#### **The Divine Service**

There are three major parts that together make up the Divine Service: Confession and Absolution, Service of the Word, and Service of the Sacrament. God comes to us through Word and Sacraments. The focus of the Divine Service is our gracious Lord coming down to serve us with His gifts. The most important part of the Divine Service are those times when He descends to meet us with saving grace in the most personal ways such as Holy absolution, Holy Scripture, and Holy Communion. This guide will give you a simple idea why God comes to us in this way and how we respond to His great love.

#### **Confession and Absolution**

**Invocation:** God's invitation at the beginning of the service to remember our Baptism.

*Confession and Absolution:* We admit to God our sins, and He in His mercy forgives (absolves) us.

#### Service of the Word

*Kyrie Elesion:* Greek for "Lord have mercy". A cry to God to have mercy on us and all humanity.

*Hymn of Praise:* A prayer song about either God's glory or lordship. *Word of God and Sermon:* In the sermon, the Word of God is brought to bear on the lives of the hearers.

*Creed:* From the Latin for "I believe". Words of faith confessing the teachings of Holy Scripture.

#### **Service of the Sacrament**

*Sanctus:* Latin for "holy". Drawn from the song of angels, rejoicing in the presence of God.

*Words of Our Lord:* The words of Jesus, spoken by the pastor over the bread and wine, by which the body and blood of Christ are truly present, distributed and received.

*Lord's Prayer:* Jesus taught His disciples this prayer and today is continued to be prayed as He instructed.

**Agnus Dei:** Latin for "Lamb of God". Jesus is called the Lamb of God who takes sins away. He is present in His body and blood to have mercy and grant peace.

*Nunc Dimittis:* Latin for "now [let Your servant] depart". A departing song in worship that also anticipates a return to the House of the Lord.

**Benediction:** A blessing from the Lord, spoken by the pastor at the end of the service.
