The Pharisees and scribes had gathered to Jesus when they witnessed His disciples eating with defiled, unwashed hands. This contradicted the tradition of the elders. They questioned Jesus for allowing His disciples to do this. Jesus called them hypocrites. This “heart” of the Pharisees and scribes, and really of all mankind, Jesus speaks to specifically in our Gospel text today. **We welcome everyone to God’s house today!**

The Lord’s Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord’s Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.





The Armor of God - Ephesians 6:10-17

All the pieces of the armor are attached to God's Word

v. 14 The Belt of Truth: the belt protects the midsection. This enables us to discern and recognize Satan's lies. The waist is the "bread basket". The truth of God's Word enables us to discern that the bread Satan offers is a lie – Jesus is the bread of life (*John 6:35*).

v. 14 The Breastplate of Righteousness: the breastplate protects the heart. The first thing Satan wants to do is make us doubt our relationship with God. We are protected with the blood of Jesus Christ and the certainty that if we repent, we are forgiven children of God.

v. 15 The Shoes of the Gospel of Peace: shoes provide a solid foundation. Through Christ, we have firm footing to move forward. We trust in Christ's work, not burdened by the past but forgiven so we can live for Him in the days ahead.

v. 16 The Shield of Faith: the shield blocks the temptations that Satan sends our way – it totally protects us. We are in a constant spiritual battle. Satan tries to use all things to our detriment. He always tries to bring up things that cause us to doubt. Use the shield of faith to quench his fiery arrows.

v. 17 The Helmet of Salvation: the helmet protects the head. The helmet helps us keep everything in perspective (*Matthew 16:26*). The joy of eternal hope (*Job 19:25 "I know my Redeemer lives"*) Through Jesus death and resurrection, we **KNOW** that we belong to God and heaven is our home.

v. 17 The Sword of the Spirit: the only offensive weapon to protect us to move forward to proclaim the gospel, to proclaim the victory of Jesus Christ. We can stand against Satan by hearing, reading, and studying God's Word. (*Hebrews 4:12*) God's Word is our spiritual food.

Get dressed with the Word of God to protect yourself from Satan's attacks. Make the Word of God a top priority.
