In the *Old Testament Reading*, the basis for this study, we hear how the Lord will reverse all the ramifications of sin for His people. This happens in Jesus, the Messiah. During his ministry, He foreshadowed what is to come on the Last Day as He cared for those who cried out to Him in their physical needs (cf Lk 7:18–23). We say by faith today, and will say by sight on the Last Day, the words of the astonished crowd: “He has done all things well” (Mk 7:37).

The Lord’s Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord’s Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

OUR OFFERINGS TO THE LORD FROM HIS BLESSINGS TO US.

Offerings remind us of the blessings God has given us and are an opportunity to thank Him for what He has done in our lives. Please place your offerings in our Offering Box located in the narthex of the church.

In Matthew 19:14 Jesus said, “Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven.”

We welcome children and all the joy and little chatter that comes with them. If for any reason you want to take your little one out, there is a Nursery (Cry Room) available for use, located just outside the sanctuary.

Depending on the translation used, “**Do not be afraid**” is found 70 times in the Bible. 70 is the number of perfect completeness. In contrast, “**fear not**” is found 57 times in the Old Testament and 14 in the New Testament, but “**Fear God**” can be found over 300 times throughout the Bible. Long story short, “the fear of the Lord” as revealed to us in God’s Holy Word and reflected in the Lutheran confessions shows us that “the fear of the Lord” like “the mercy of the Lord” and “the Love of God” is meant for our ultimate eternal benefit. “**The fear of the Lord**” is part of the relationship God has established with His people. We do not need to be afraid of this world for He is with us. (Isaiah 41:10) *For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.* ~ 2 Timothy 1:7 ~






