**The Lord's Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.**

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

**The Five Solas ("Alones")**

These *alones* are foundational for the Christian life and were at the heart of what Martin Luther was struggling with before he rediscovered the Gospel. Life as a Christian can be lived confidently when lived by these solas:

***Sola Scriptura*** ("*Scripture alone*"): *The Bible alone is our highest authority. (2 Timothy 3:14-17)*

***Sola Fide*** ("*faith alone*"): *We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ. (Romans 3:21-28)*

***Sola Gratia*** ("*grace alone*"): *We are saved by the free gift of grace of God alone. (Eph. 2:4-9)*

***Solus Christus*** ("*Christ alone*"): *Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior, and King. (John 14:1-7)*

***Soli Deo Gloria*** ("*to the glory of God alone*"): *We live for the glory of God alone. (1 Peter 4:7-13)*

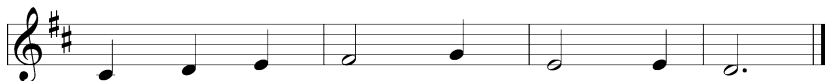
