Recent Events



School Corner

We finished January by celebrating our Lutheran school heritage during <u>National Lutheran</u>
<u>Schools Week, Jan. 27th-31st.</u> As one of the 800+ Lutheran elementary schools in the nation,

we appreciate the ability to offer a Christian education in our area, not only to educate children, but also to teach them about the saving grace of Jesus and in the wisdom and wealth of the Bible. Along with the fun activities we had that week, we also raised money for *Right to Life of North Central Indiana*, *in memory of Jane Stillson*, and to educate the students on the history behind Jane's Park.

Jane's Park was built in honor of Jane Stillson, wife of Dr. Tod Stillson (Plymouth). Jane was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1997, when she was a few weeks pregnant with their daughter, and it was recommended by the doctor that she have an abortion. She and her husband declined the abortion, placing their faith and trust in God; thereby, delaying aggressive cancer treatment. After their healthy daughter was born, Jane began aggressive treatment, but passed away in early 1999. She and her husband demonstrated faith and loving sacrifice, which is why we wanted to remember them by supporting RTL.

The Teacher Wish List Tree will be in the narthex for a couple weeks in February. Thank you for showing love and appreciation to our teachers (and Extended Care and the library) by donating items from their lists!

February is Reading Month, a chance for students to earn privileges and awards (and hone those reading skills) for the amount of reading points accumulated. Students will also be recognized as top readers in their class and the school. If the entire school accumulates 1200 points combined, they will earn a special field trip (TBA)! Reading helps children develop early literacy skills, sparks imagination and curiosity, helps to develop the brain, improves focus and memory skills, improves communication skills, increases the vocabulary, and improves cognitive development- to name a few. SGO Fundraising is Ongoing!

January started the new tax cycle for the Lutheran SGO, and new opportunities to receive a tax credit and deduction for your donations for 2025!
