We welcome everyone to God's house today for the second part of our stewardship sermon series. Today we will look at the biblical principle that we who are God's stewards are managers, not owners. May God grace us with His presence.

The Lord's Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord's Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

OUR OFFERINGS TO THE LORD FROM HIS BLESSINGS TO US.

Offerings remind us of the blessings God has given us and are an opportunity to thank Him for what He has done in our lives. Please place your offerings in our Offering Box located in the narthex of the church.

We welcome children and all the joy and little chatter that comes with them. If for any reason you want to take your little one out, there is a Nursery (Cry Room) available for use, located just outside the sanctuary.

It is good for us to be reminded why we operate Lutheran schools. There are many differences between our Lutheran schools and public schools. The primary difference always comes down to the goal of our teaching is always that students are brought to and kept in saving faith in Christ and are therefore heirs of eternal life. Teaching a Christian worldview in our schools prepares young people for lives of service in Christ's name, both within the Church and out into the world. The Lutheran understanding of vocation helps young people to see how God uses them and the gifts and abilities that they have received from Him to serve God and their neighbor. They teach that children have value based upon God creating them in His own image and that they are all children for whom Christ died. Our schools help students understand service, marriage, family, citizenship, and work from a Christian worldview and provide a place of refuge where teachers help them to see God's design for the world and their own lives. We need Lutheran schools now more than ever before. Please support their vital work with your prayers and your gifts. Lastly, encourage families to send their children to one of these schools. It is one of the most important investments that they can make in their children's lives.

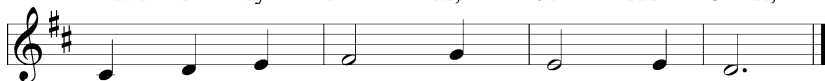
