The reading of the triumphal entry narrative shows the humble servanthood of Christ, while the Passion Narrative shows that He is the Suffering Servant. Both texts follow the first part of the *Epistle* (vv 5–8) in extolling the Lord’s humiliation, while the second part (vv 9–11) lets us not forget His exaltation even in the midst of contemplating His Passion and death.

We welcome everyone to God’s House this morning!

The Lord’s Supper is a very special privilege God gives to His people.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because the Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive this sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. If you are not partaking of the Lord’s Supper but would like to receive a blessing, please come up to the communion rail when sent by an elder, kneel, and cross your arms over your chest. The Pastor will then know that you desire a blessing.

OUR OFFERINGS TO THE LORD FROM HIS BLESSINGS TO US.

Offerings remind us of the blessings God has given us and are an opportunity to thank Him for what He has done in our lives. Please place your offerings in our Offering Box located in the narthex of the church, near the water fountain.

In Matthew 19:14 Jesus said, “Let the little children come to me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven.”

Children are a vital part of our church family. They learn and grow in their faith by regularly worshipping with us. We welcome all children to be actively participating in the service but if for any reason you want or need to take your little one out, there is a Nursery available for your use. It is located just outside the sanctuary.

Shouting praise to Jesus: “Hosanna to the Son of David!” got the religious leaders upset. “Do You hear what they’re saying?” they asked Him. Jesus quoted from the book of Psalms, asking, “Have you never read, ‘Out of the mouth of infants and nursing babies You have prepared praise’?” It seems odd that God would want praise from the weakest and lowliest of people—from children. But He does. He treasures it. This is good news for us, too, for we are just as weak and lowly as little children. We desperately need a Savior. And so with the little children we cry out “Hosanna!” In Hebrew it literally means, “Please save us.” Jesus hears our cry. Through His suffering, death, and resurrection, He has become our Savior. We cry out in glad joy, praising Him along with the children-and with all creation. **“HOSANNA!”**

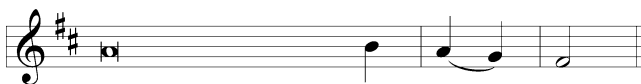
