a man came death, by a Man has come also the resurrection of the dead. ²² **For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.”**

The events of Easter are the God-given truth, revealed in His Holy Word.
Believe it by the power of the Holy Spirit or die apart from the Kingdom of God.

ST. PAUL'S TREASURER RESPONSIBILITIES

As part of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee's efforts to develop a simpler church administration organization, the treasurer position is being redefined. The proposed revised duties of the treasurer would be as listed below, in addition, the position would no longer be a church executive board position, so it could be carried out by male or female members of the congregation.

1. Maintain income and expenses ledgers (offerings, gifts, donations, choice scholarship funds from state, expenses against budgets, expenses / reimbursements for individual members where appropriate)

2. Banking : Maintain day to day transactions within the General Fund bank account and account for all transactions between specific other bank accounts overseen by Treasurer (with Lori Haug's assistance)
 - Youth account
 - Reserve Funds account
 - Facilities Expansion account (minimal transactions in recent years)

- Missions account

3. Payroll : Maintain all employee employment/pay records in the computer file system. Interface with external firm that handles payroll function, including related W-2 and payroll tax filings

4. Periodic summary financial reporting for voters meetings, parish planning meetings, and weekly cash position reporting to parish planning council

5. Payments: issue checks against expenses as appropriate and record in ledger

6. Communication: answer questions from boards and staff regarding ledgers/funds/procedures.

7. Prepare any year-end tax/financial compliance reporting such as corporation reports; personal property tax return; assist where needed with IRS required information on donations > \$250 reporting.

We are asking that any member of the congregation willing to serve in any or all of these duties please advise a member of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee (Nathan Miller, Kevin Furman, Ken Eichinger, Dave Burcham). Mark Matejka, who has served as treasurer for St. Paul's congregation for several years, desires to be relieved of his position. The transition of duties from Mark to whomever replaces him would be a gradual one and dependent on the experience and schedules of the individual(s) willing to fulfill the above duties. A specific timeline for transition would be established after volunteers to serve are determined.

If there are no congregation members willing to serve in fulfilling these duties of a treasurer, we will need to use an external accounting firm. This would result in additional budget expense.

Please prayerfully consider serving to fulfill the treasurer's duties outlined above and contact one of the committee members to advise your willingness.

Evangelism Board

The Evangelism Board is sharing excerpts from the tract "What Lutherans Teach". Refresh your Biblical knowledge to better share your faith with others! This month we will look at 'Repentance' and 'Faith'.

Lutherans teach that repentance, in the Biblical sense of the term, is acknowledgment of sin and sincere regret for it-together with a trustful appeal to God for forgiveness in Christ's name; that it is a condition of the heart without which no man can hope to be saved; and that every truly repentant sinner is assured of God's free and full pardon.

References.-Is 55:6-7; Mathew 4:17; Mark 1:15; Luke 18:13-14; Acts 2:38; 2 Corinthians 7:10.

Lutherans also teach that faith is a penitent sinner's acceptance of Jesus Christ as his real and only Savior and full reliance on His merits for forgiveness of sins and salvation; that such faith is not a personal achievement or an act of human merit, but a work of the Holy Spirit; that he who endures in this faith to the end will be really, fully, and eternally saved; and that without it no salvation is possible.

References.-John 1:12, 16; Acts 10:43; Galatians 2:16; 1 Corinthians 12:3; 1 Peter 1:5; Acts 16:31; Matthew 24:13; John 3:36.

prepare your child to be personally responsible and able to care for others. The fourth important area of development is your child's spiritual growth.

THE LAMB OF GOD (Agnus Dei) **1958** In memory of Mr. Edward L. Kiefer



The LAMB with TRI-RADIANT HALO symbolizes Jesus, True God. The BANNER Of VICTORY He carries shows His work of redemption is complete and Satan has been defeated. He stands upon the BOOK Of LIFE.

THREE SEALS evoke the Trinity, and refer to Revelation 5: only The Lamb is worthy to open the seals and JUDGE the world.

This window declares:

Jesus, the Lamb, is our Savior, God, and Judge.

“Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.” John 1:32 +

THE RESURRECTION (The Phoenix) **1958**

Based on the legendary Phoenix, which periodically burned itself on a FUNERAL PYRE (symbol of physical death); then rose from its ashes to live another cycle.

Used since the 1st century of CHRIST (Cruciform Halo), it testifies to Jesus' BODILY RESURRECTION.

Without the halo,

it depicts the general resurrection of the dead on the Last Day.

“For the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice and come forth; those who have done good to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation.” John 5:28,29 +
